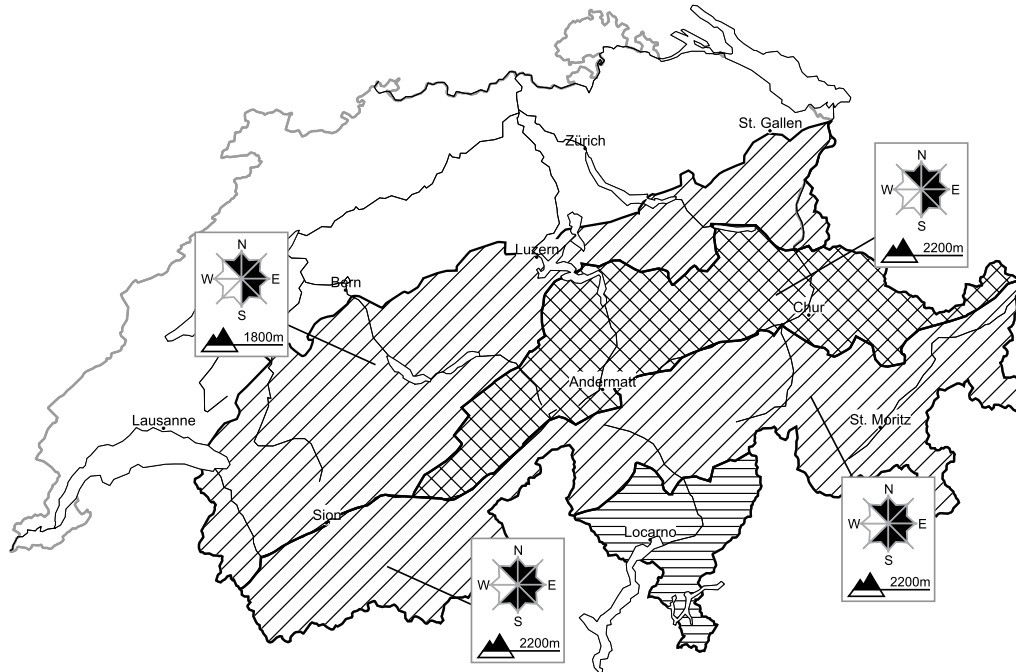


Considerable avalanche danger will be encountered in some regions. Fresh snow drifts are to be avoided

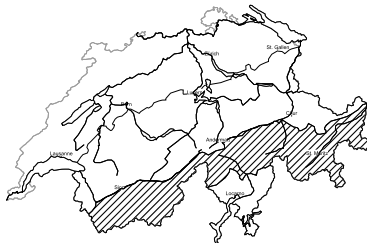

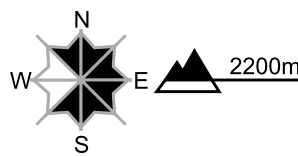
region C

Avalanche prone locations

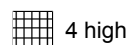
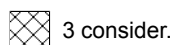
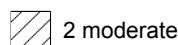
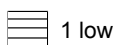


Danger description

The snow drift accumulations of Sunday represent the main danger. These are to be found in particular in gullies and bowls, and behind abrupt changes in the terrain. They are rather small but can in some cases be released easily. The snow drift accumulations are clearly recognisable to the trained eye. They are to be avoided in steep terrain.

Additionally in isolated cases avalanches can be released in the old snowpack. Caution is to be exercised in particular at transitions from a shallow to a deep snowpack. These avalanche prone locations are barely recognisable, even to the trained eye. They are to be found in particular on very steep shady slopes. Defensive route selection is recommended.
