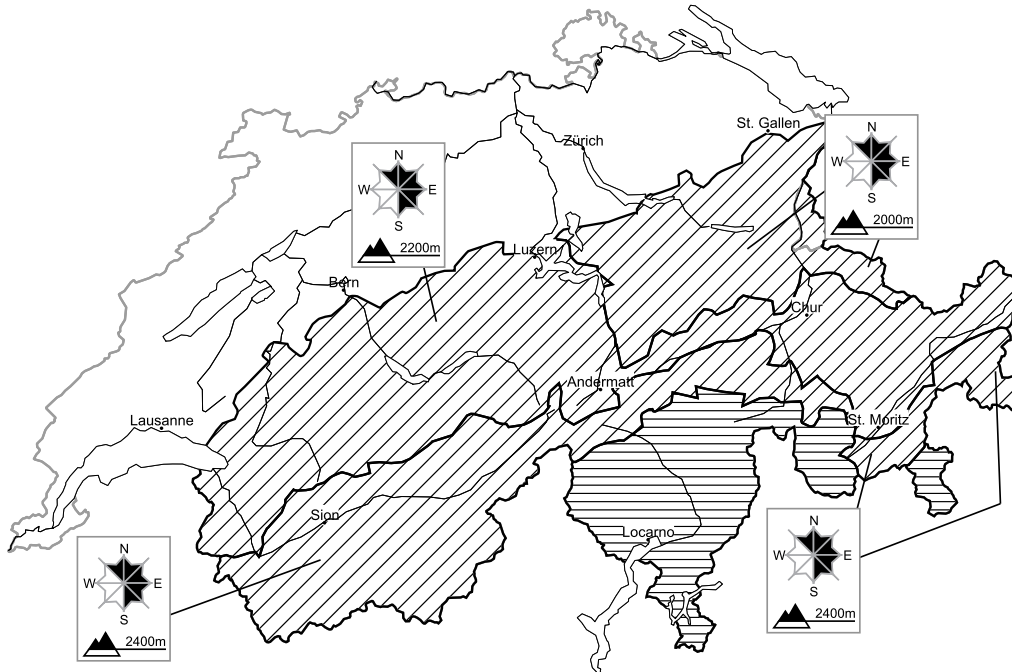


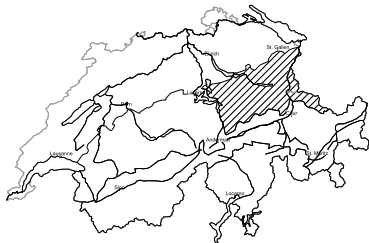
# Moderate avalanche danger will be encountered over a wide area. Snow drifts and weakly bonded old snow require caution

## Avalanche danger

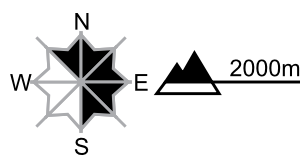


**region A** **Level 2, moderate**

#### Danger description

The snow drift accumulations of the last few days can be released by a single winter sport participant in some cases. At elevated altitudes the prevalence and size of the avalanche prone locations will increase. The snow drift accumulations are covered with fresh snow in some cases and therefore difficult to recognise. Avalanches can in very isolated cases penetrate deep layers and reach medium size. This applies in particular on steep shady slopes. Backcountry touring and other off-piste activities call for defensive route selection.

### Full-depth avalanches, Wet avalanches as day progresses

On steep grassy slopes full-depth avalanches are to be expected. Areas with glide cracks are to be avoided as far as possible. As a consequence of warming during the day and solar radiation mostly small moist snow slides and avalanches are possible.

### Remarks

The Avalanche Warning Service currently has only a small amount of information that has been collected in the field, so that the avalanche danger should be investigated especially thoroughly in the relevant locality.
