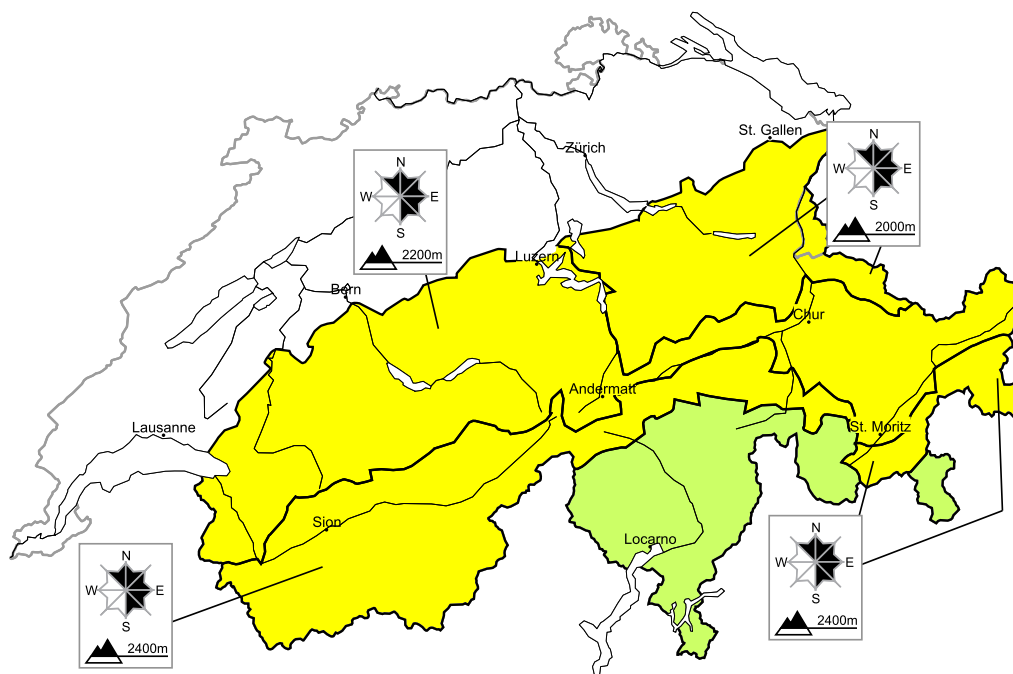


Moderate avalanche danger will be encountered over a wide area. Snow drifts and weakly bonded old snow require caution

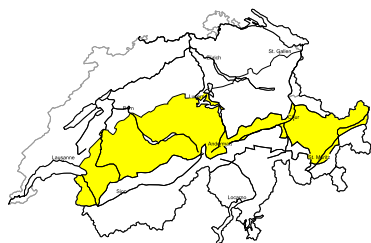

Avalanche danger



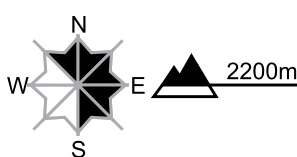
region B

Danger description

The snow drift accumulations of the last few days can be released by a single winter sport participant in some cases. These are to be found in particular in gullies and bowls, and behind abrupt changes in the terrain. The snow drift accumulations are clearly recognisable to the trained eye. They are to be avoided in steep terrain. Additionally in isolated cases avalanches can be released in the old snowpack and reach medium size. This applies in particular on steep shady slopes. Defensive route selection is recommended.

Full-depth avalanches

On steep grassy slopes full-depth avalanches are possible. Areas with glide cracks are to be avoided as far as possible.

Remarks

The Avalanche Warning Service currently has only a small amount of information that has been collected in the field, so that the avalanche danger should be investigated especially thoroughly in the relevant locality.
