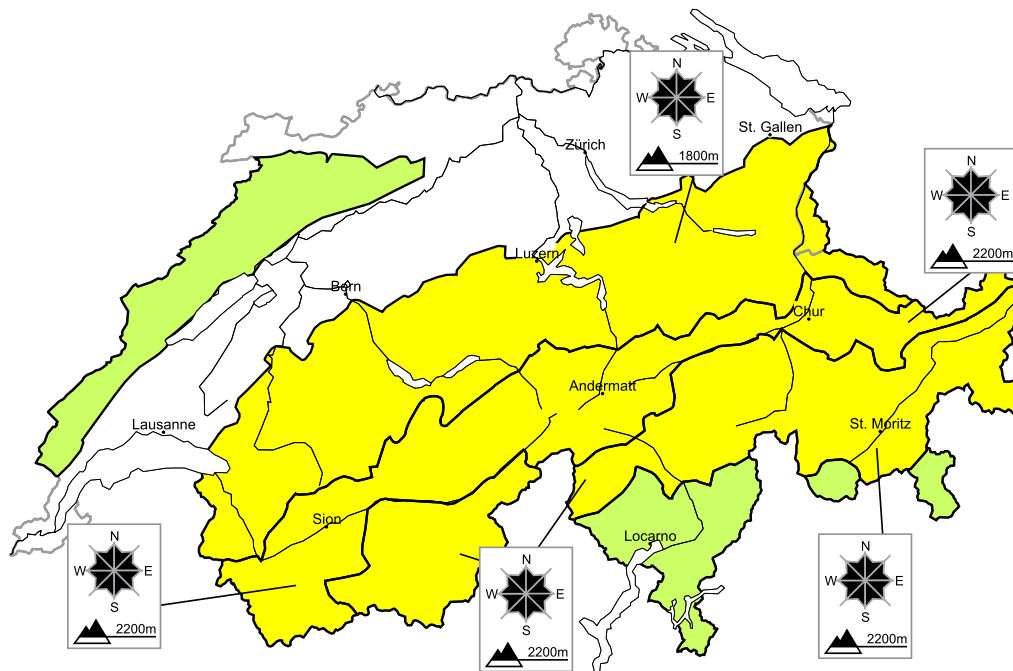


Moderate avalanche danger will be encountered over a wide area. Snow drifts require caution

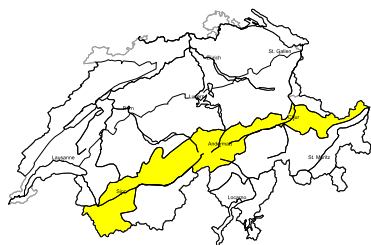

Avalanche danger



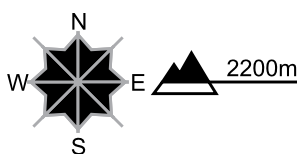
region B

Danger description

Fresh snow drift accumulations are to be found in particular adjacent to the ridge line and in pass areas. They can in some cases be released easily, but they will be small in most cases. In high Alpine regions the snow drift accumulations are larger. Avalanches can in isolated cases be released in the old snowpack. This applies in particular on steep, little used slopes. These avalanche prone locations are rare but difficult to recognise. Isolated whumpung sounds can indicate the danger. Defensive route selection is recommended.

Full-depth avalanches

Mostly small full-depth avalanches are possible on steep grassy slopes. This applies in particular on steep east, south and west facing slopes below approximately 2000 m. Areas with glide cracks are to be avoided as far as possible.
