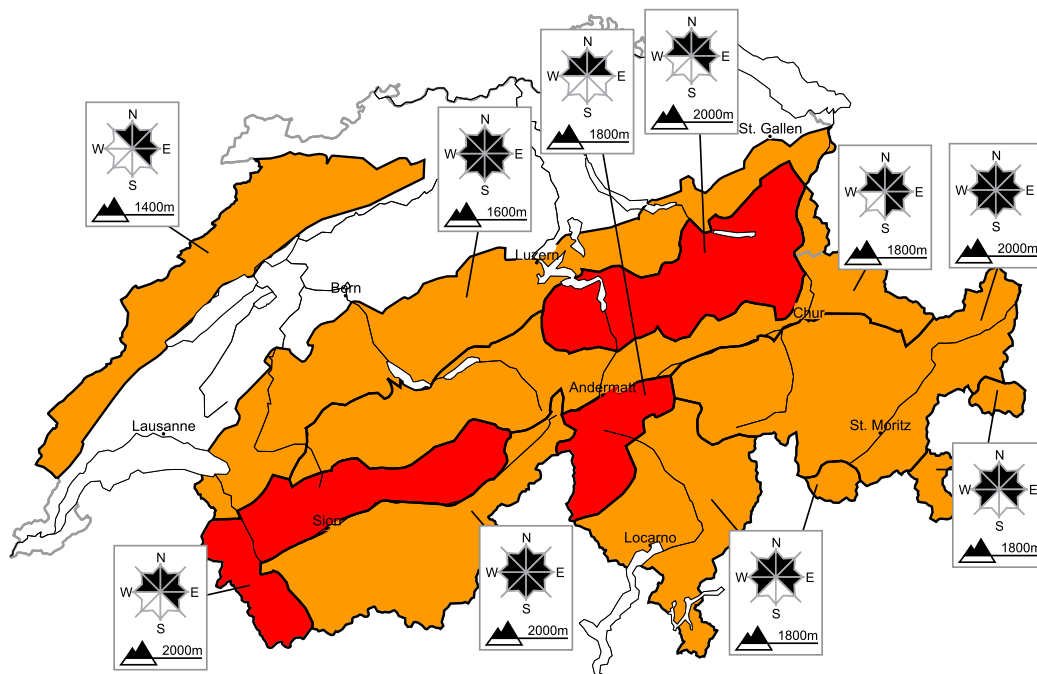


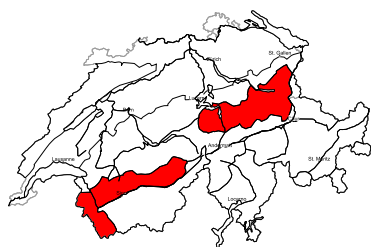

Avalanche danger

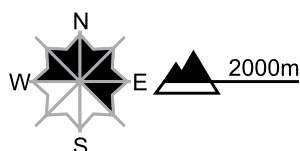


region A **Level 4, high**

Danger description

As a consequence of fresh snow and strong wind extensive snow drift accumulations have formed. Avalanches can be released, even by a single winter sport participant and reach dangerously large size. Individual natural avalanches are possible. The danger exists primarily in alpine snow sports terrain. Avalanches capable of reaching valley bottoms and endangering exposed transportation routes are unlikely to occur. Snow sport activities outside marked and open pistes call for extensive experience in the assessment of avalanche danger and great restraint.

Full-depth avalanches

On steep grassy slopes more full-depth avalanches are to be expected. This applies in particular on steep east, south and west facing slopes below approximately 2200 m as well as on north facing slopes below approximately 1800 m. Areas with glide cracks are to be avoided as far as possible.
