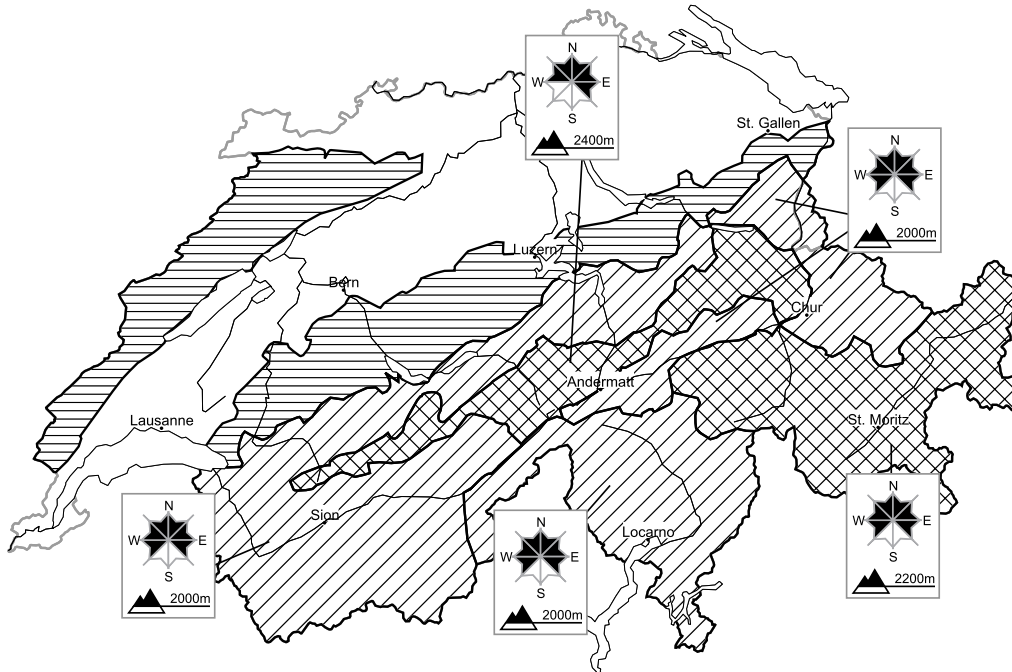


# Considerable avalanche danger will be encountered in some regions. Full-depth avalanches on steep grassy slopes

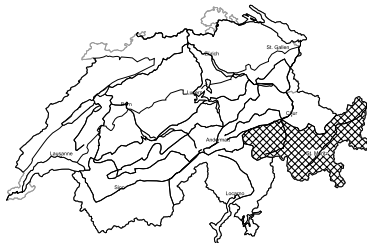

## Avalanche danger



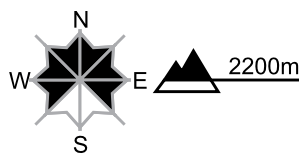

#### Danger description

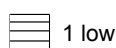
The fresh and somewhat older snow drift accumulations are in some cases prone to triggering. Avalanches can be released, even by a single winter sport participant. They can penetrate deep layers and reach dangerously large size.

Snow sport activities outside marked and open pistes call for extensive experience in the assessment of avalanche danger.

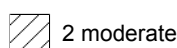
#### Full-depth avalanches

Below approximately 2200 m full-depth avalanches are possible, including quite large ones. This applies in particular on steep east, south and west facing slopes. They can be released at any time of day or night. Areas with glide cracks are to be avoided as far as possible.

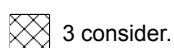
#### Danger levels



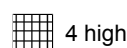

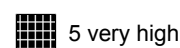
2 moderate
