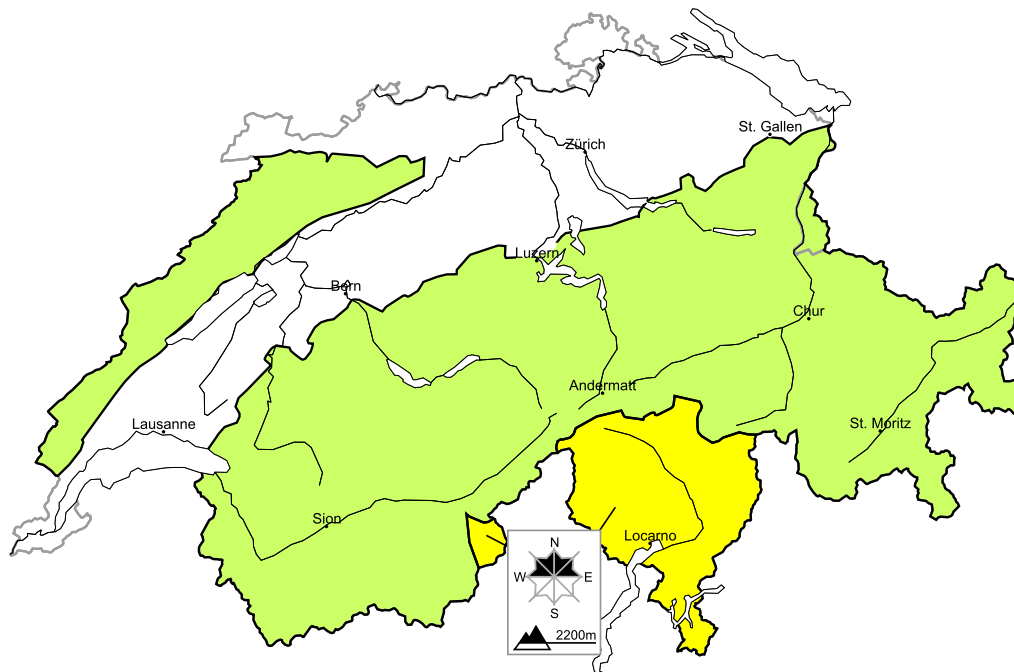

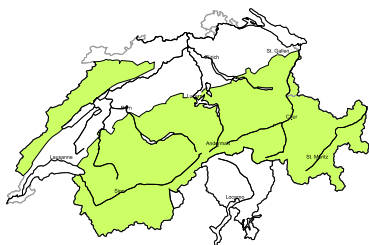

Dry avalanches

Avalanches can in isolated cases be released in near-surface layers of the snowpack. Mostly they are only small. Caution is to be exercised in particular in extremely steep terrain. Apart from the danger of being buried, restraint should be exercised in particular in view of the danger of avalanches sweeping people along and giving rise to falls. At elevated altitudes the prevalence and size of the avalanche prone locations will increase.

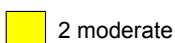
Full-depth avalanches

Isolated full-depth avalanches are possible, especially on east, south and west facing slopes below approximately 2400 m as well as on north facing slopes below approximately 2000 m. Caution is to be exercised in areas with glide cracks.

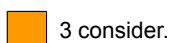
Danger levels



1 low



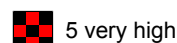
2 moderate
