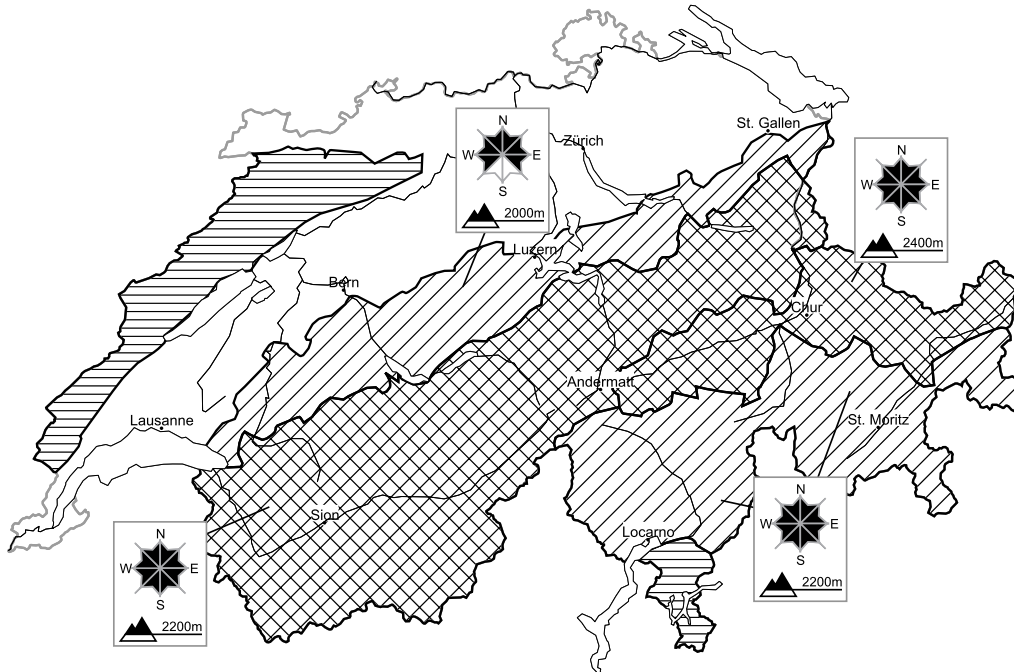


Outside marked and open pistes a considerable avalanche danger will be encountered over a wide area

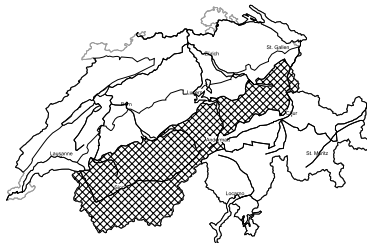

Avalanche danger



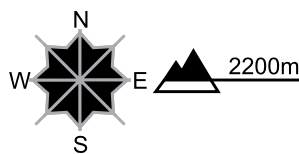
region A

Avalanche prone locations



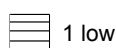
Danger description

The somewhat older snow drift accumulations can be released by a single winter sport participant in some cases. The avalanche prone locations are covered with fresh snow and difficult to recognise. Isolated whumpung sounds can indicate the danger. Off-piste activities call for experience in the assessment of avalanche danger.

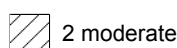
Full-depth avalanches

Individual full-depth avalanches are possible, especially on east, south and west facing slopes below approximately 2400 m as well as on north facing slopes below approximately 2000 m.

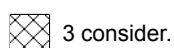
Danger levels



1 low



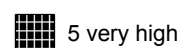
2 moderate
