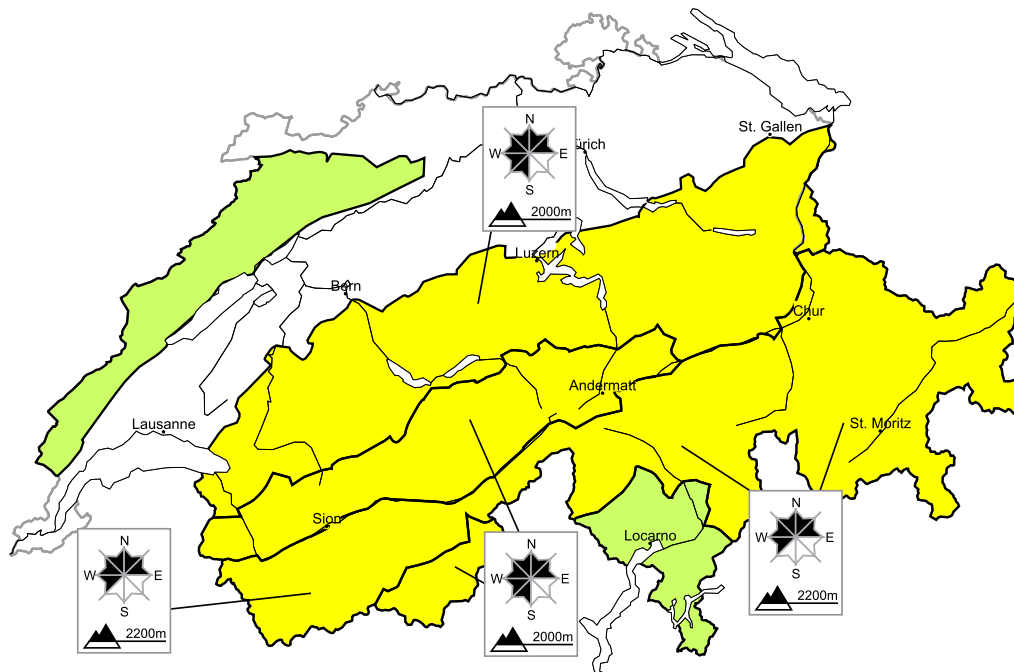


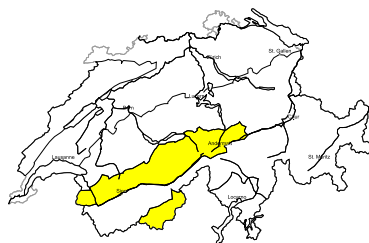
# Moderate avalanche danger will be encountered over a wide area

## Avalanche danger

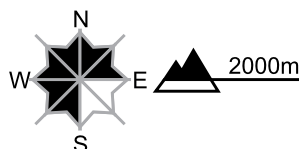


**region A** **Level 2, moderate**



### Snow drifts

#### Avalanche prone locations



#### Danger description

The rather small snow drift accumulations of Saturday are lying on the unfavourable surface of an old snowpack. They can in some cases be released by a single winter sport participant. The fresh snow drift accumulations are clearly recognisable to the trained eye. They must be evaluated with care and prudence. In high Alpine regions avalanche prone locations are more widespread and the danger is slightly greater.

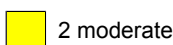
### Old snow

Weak layers in the upper part of the snowpack can be released by people in particular in little used backcountry terrain. This applies in particular above approximately 2400 m. These avalanche prone locations are rare but barely recognisable, even to the trained eye. Careful route selection is important.

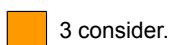
**Danger levels**



1 low



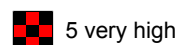
2 moderate
