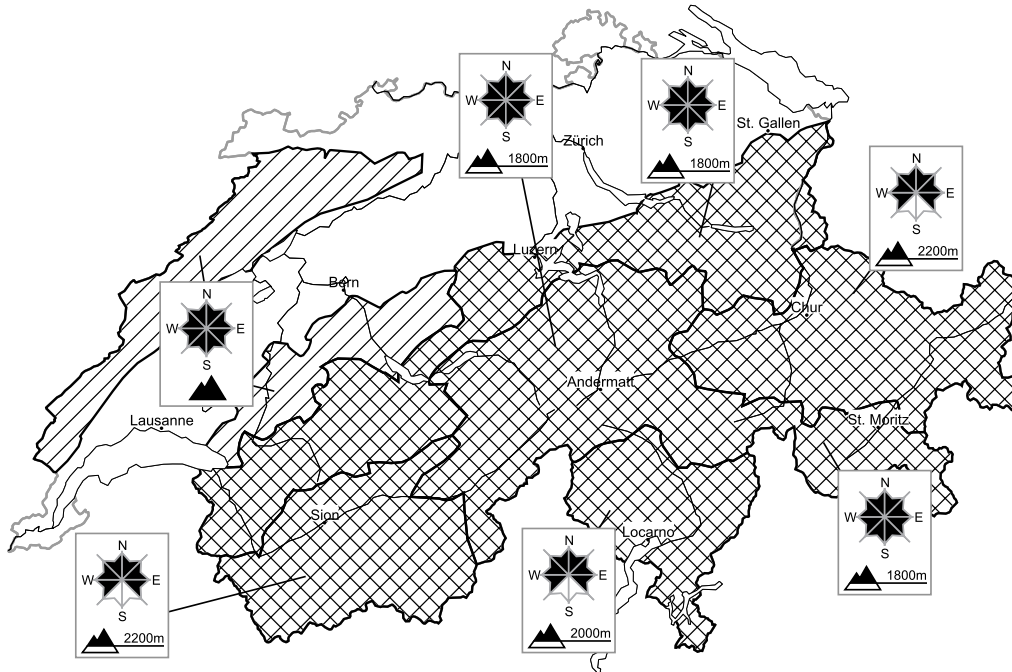

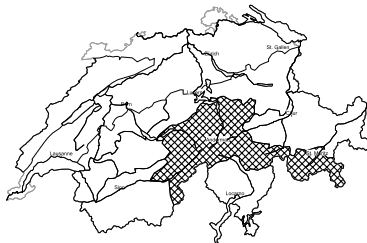

Avalanche danger



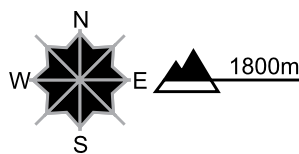
region A

Danger description

The fresh snow and snow drift accumulations of the last few days are prone to triggering. As a consequence of the southerly wind further snow drift accumulations will form. Even single snow sport participants can release avalanches. In isolated cases avalanches can release the weakly bonded old snow as well and reach quite a large size. As the day progresses the likelihood of dry avalanches being released will increase. Natural avalanches are possible. Backcountry touring and other off-piste activities call for extensive experience in the assessment of avalanche danger.

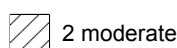
Wet avalanches as day progresses, Full-depth avalanches

On steep sunny slopes numerous moist avalanches are to be expected. Below approximately 2400 m full-depth avalanches are possible. Avalanches can in some cases reach dangerously large size. Exposed parts of transportation routes can be endangered. Backcountry tours should be concluded timely.

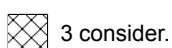

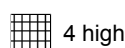

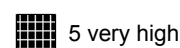
